What is the problem with the parite law in contemporary France, according to Fraisse? What do you think of her argument?

What are the principle objections that the authors raise to the law forbidding the wearing of Islamic headscarves in French public schools?

What point are they trying to make when they say that "the headscarf is a French phenomenon"?

Do you think that the decision to weak a headscarf could be categorized as "feminist" in certain situations?

Why do you think that this issue so controversial in France as opposed to the U.S., where it has never been a matter of controversy or public debate?
